

PUPIL SURVEY

Spring 2026



SUMMARY HEADLINES

- **141 pupils from Year 2 to Year 6 completed an online survey.**



- **All classes, from Nursery to Year 6, also took part in a class-based survey responding to the two questions presented at the end of this summary.**

- **There were 98.6% positive responses that children would recommend St Luke’s to a friend moving to the area.**

- **Several questions achieved a 100% positive response including:**

- **The behaviour of other pupils around school is good.**
- **Teachers help me to do my best.**
- **My school encourages me to respect people from other backgrounds and to treat everyone equally.**



The question that received the lowest proportion of positive responses from pupils related to participation in school activities beyond lessons, such as clubs, sports, music and art. While many pupils do take part in the wider life of the school, this feedback suggests that not all children feel equally engaged or encouraged to participate in enrichment opportunities. This is an important area for us to explore further, particularly in understanding any barriers that may exist.

Encouragingly, twelve of the seventeen questions showed either an increase or the same proportion of positive responses compared to last year’s pupil survey. This demonstrates that the majority of pupils continue to feel positive about their experiences at school and that improvements made over the past year are being recognised.

The largest increase was seen in the question relating to behaviour around the school being good, with a 2.1% rise. This reflects the continued focus on high expectations, consistency and positive relationships across the school. Two other questions also showed notable improvements: more pupils feel that the school encourages them to look after their physical health (+1.4%), and an increased proportion feel that teachers listen to what they have to say in lessons (+1.3%). These outcomes highlight the impact of our work on pupil wellbeing and strengthening pupil voice within the classroom.

A small number of questions showed a decrease in positive responses. In particular, the question relating to the school providing information about next steps saw three children indicate that they had not received any information. While this is a small number, it is important that all pupils feel clear about how they can improve and what they are working towards.

It is particularly pleasing that, while two pupils indicated that they would not recommend St Luke’s to a friend moving to the area, 139 pupils said that they would. 98.6% represents a 1.4% increase compared to last year and is a strong endorsement of the school community and the experience we provide.

In summary, the survey reflects very positive views from pupils while also identifying clear areas for further development. To strengthen our provision, we will:

- Use pupil voice to better understand why some pupils do not enjoy learning at school.
- Further promote participation in activities beyond the school day to ensure all children feel encouraged and able to take part.
- Ensure that staff consistently provide clear next steps so that every child understands how to improve and feels supported in their learning journey.
