


ST LUKE'S C.E. PRIMARY SCHOOL

Parents were invited to share their views through a survey available at the end of the academic year using a Google Form. This was shared through a link in the newsletter and email correspondence. 136 responses were received.








St Luke's keeps my child safe


Agree - 100% Disagree - 0%













I am pleased with the home/school relationship




Agree - 96% Disagree - 4%

We would like to make the following suggestions:

I wondered if there is any information given about the transition into year 1 / new teachers?

It would be great to understand how children progress with phonics, how they proceed to the next phase with their reading books.

To continue supporting the internal and external variety of clubs available to the students.

Putting funds towards air conditioning to the main hall where most activities are held.

Sometimes communications from the school are confusing. We don't feel we have gotten to know the staff well yet as there is so little time to meet

If possible, arrange parents to have classroom visit so as to observe how their children learn / behave in classes. Both my children get super stressed about changing for PE it would be so much easier if they simply wore their PE kit on the days they have sport. It would be especially helpful at this time of year when it's hot and uncomfortable to be changing.

Consider using coach transport again for more local trips instead of public transport-appreciate the latter is generally free, but think managing the logistics and uncertainty on timings make it worthwhile.

Parent/teacher meeting in final term to discuss school report and end of year/recommendations for year 1 and summer holiday work.

We honestly can't think of any way that the primary school experience could have been better for our three children (except maybe no COVID....) Thank you to all of you for everything you have done over the last 11 years to help and support them. We will miss St Luke's so much.
