How much has your school spent on CPD for academic year 2025 to 2026?	1,955	9.9%	The PE Leader attended county dance training and specialist coaches delivered gymnastics sessions alongside staff. This developed staff subject knowledge, confidence and leadership capacity, enabling high-quality PE teaching to be sustained. Pupils benefited from improved technical teaching, greater engagement and increased participation.
How much has your school spent on CPD upskilling staff to deliver swimming lessons for academic year 2025 to 2026?	0	0%	No expenditure was required as the school employed a highly qualified specialist swimming teacher to deliver lessons, ensuring pupils received high-quality swimming provision.
How much has your school spent extracurricular opportunities for academic year 2025 to 2026?	1,139	5.8%	Funding supported a before-school netball club, cross-country training for Years 5 and 6, and Sports Day at Kingsmeadow Athletics Stadium. These opportunities increased participation in sport, developed teamwork and resilience, and provided pupils with memorable competitive experiences.
How much has your school spent on equipment and resources for academic year 2025 to 2026?	2,900	14.7%	Funding was used to purchase new PE equipment and maintain sporting surfaces. This ensured pupils had access to safe, high-quality resources and facilities, supporting effective PE lessons, clubs and year-round physical activity.
How much has your school spent on membership and subscription fees for academic year 2025 to 2026?	860	4.4%	Funding supported the Primary PE Planning subscription and membership of the Kingston School Sports Partnership. These improved curriculum consistency, staff confidence and progression while providing pupils with access to competitions, festivals and wider sporting opportunities.
How much has your school spent on activities organised by the SGO network for academic year 2025 to 2026?	4,284	21.7%	Funding covered staff release and transport costs to enable participation in School Games and Kingston School Sports Partnership events. Pupils gained increased opportunities to compete, developing confidence, teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship while representing the school.
How much has your school spent on entering external school sports competitions for academic year 2025 to 2026?	240	1.2%	Funding enabled pupils to attend local competitions and the borough athletics event. These opportunities increased participation in competitive sport, developing confidence, resilience, teamwork and links with other schools.

How much has your school spent on external coaching staff for academic year 2025 to 2026?	8,345	42.3%	Funding provided a lunchtime sports coach to deliver activities, organise the St Luke's World Tour football tournament and promote active play. Specialist skipping and trampolining workshops also broadened pupils' sporting experiences. This increased participation, improved behaviour at lunchtimes and developed pupils' confidence, teamwork and enjoyment of physical activity.
