



### Pupil Survey Spring 2025

All classes, from Nursery to Year 6, contributed to the two questions presented at the end of this summary. Additionally, 142 pupils from Year 2 to Year 6 participated in the online survey. In this context, 0.70% corresponds to one pupil.

### SURVEY SUMMARY COMMENTS

Four questions received the highest proportion of positive responses from pupils. Enjoying learning at St Luke’s, pupils feeling safe, teachers helping pupils to do their best and the school encouraging pupils to respect people from other backgrounds and to treat everyone equally received 100%.

The question which received the lowest proportion of positive responses from pupils was centred on bullying where 2.1% (3 pupils) felt that it happens and teachers are not good at resolving it and 2.8% (4 pupils) felt that it happens and that teachers do nothing about it. Interestingly, a higher proportion of pupils felt that the behaviour around the school and in lessons is good with 97.9% and 98.6% positive responses respectively.

11 out of 17 questions show either an increase or the same proportion of positive responses compared to the pupil survey conducted last year.

The largest increase was seen in the question relating to behaviour in class being good with a 5.6% increase. Two other questions showed a strong increase with the question relating to the school encouraging pupils to look after their emotional and mental health (+ 1.7%) and pupils feeling safe in school (+1.0%).

There were a few questions that showed a decrease in positive responses including the question about the school encouraging children to look after their physical health where 3 pupils disagreed.

While 4 pupils indicated they would not recommend St. Luke’s to a friend moving to the area, 138 pupils said they would. Notably, although the number of pupils who disagreed remains unchanged from last year, there is a slight decrease of 1.9% in the proportion of pupils who responded 'yes' to this question.

In summary, the survey shows very positive opinions from pupils at the school whilst highlighting several actions to improve our educational offer including:

- Use pupil voice to understand why some pupils do not enjoy school or believe that bullying is not resolved appropriately.
- Remind pupils who they can talk to if something is worrying them.
- Look for additional ways to encourage pupils to look after their physical health.
