

Which class is your child/children in? (tick all that apply)



Has your child been able to access the online learning provided by school?



Has your child accessed live face to face learning via Google Meet sessions?





# Are there any improvements you would like to see to our remote education provision that we are providing during this lockdown?

It would be nice if the children could have actual lessons remotely too. Maybe 1 or 2 classes a day.

Very good provision. More explanation on maths would be great please rather than just going through the answers.

Is there any ability for more live lessons. I appreciate this may be difficult to accommodate but feel there might be more engagement if some lessons were done live. There may also be more understanding because as a parent if you do not understand the topic (e.g. grammar) it is very difficult to explain and support your child.

The one improvement I would like to see is all the weeks learning uploaded by the Friday of the week before. Working parents who are also trying to teach their children need to use the weekend to work ahead and make the working week more manageable.

There is always room for more feedback on work which has been handed in online.

A set time table of work, for example what is usually published on the classroom doors.

Extra optional tasks set for kids who want more of a challenge and/or finish the work set quickly.

More face to face classes with the teacher.

I would prefer to see more focus on the core subjects (English, reading, spelling & maths) and some other items not being carried on (RE, Latin, science, music etc).

# Are there any improvements you would like to see to our remote education provision that we are providing during this lockdown?

Please could you reduce the amount of daily assignments. Sometimes it can be 5pm before we complete everything on google classroom and I think it would benefit my child if she was able to do other things after 3pm.

It would be good to have a few more tasks that are not screen based.

There are sometimes lengthy instructions for certain tasks which could be broken down for children to complete without parents having to explain.

I hope the teacher could spend a bit time explaining to the children about past & present tense, punctuations, verbs, adverbs and other concepts of English. I know the child can read through the material provided but that doesn't mean he or she is able to fully understand or apply the concepts. It is very difficult for the non-native English speaking parents to teach the children English.

Some of the live lessons are lasting 45-60 minutes which is reducing engagement.

Would be great if the google meet sessions could go on longer as my son really enjoys them - but I accept this may not be realistic. Mixing with his classmates his good for his morale.

I would like to say it's great to see such an improvement in the online learning provision since lockdown 1.

No improvements to suggest.

# Do you have any comments about the remote education provision provided by school, positive or negative?

I really appreciate the hard work being put in by the teaching staff during this difficult time. I am impressed by the remote learning provision.

Good stuff on offer. Quite hard to get my child to do it though.

Better than last year and full marks to all the staff for juggling school being open and assisting with homeschooling I know it is hard. Let's hope for all our sakes this doesn't go on for ever! Appreciate its hard for everyone so thanks for being approachable and helpful whenever we engage with the staff.

The remote education set-up in this lockdown is so much better than the first lockdown. Having daily contact with the class teacher and with the rest of the class on the live calls is great and having specific tasks assigned each day is a huge improvement. I have heard similar positive comments from other parents in the class as well. Well done to the St Luke's staff for these improvements!

Love the structure it provides and the requirements to hand things in. Really helps parents and kids to have structure and routine so they know exactly what needs doing when

I couldn't be happier with the teaching team, the support, the engagement with the children is great. We appreciate the whole school's hard work. Thank you.

I think the teachers and head teachers have done an incredible job adapting in ways that no one can be expected to train or have skills for. To keep up a cheery composure for so long must be exhausting. Particularly with the recent rumours of lockdown going through Easter, which is 70 more days.

The highlight of my child's day is the live zoom sessions with the teacher and her classmates.

# Do you have any comments about the remote education provision provided by school, positive or negative?

The remote education provision for this lockdown has been fantastic. The number of lessons/activities set mirrors a typical length class day and is achievable for each child. The together sessions at the start and end of the day help to demarcate the school day, and provide a sense of class belonging. The consistency of approach between the different year groups means that managing siblings is made much easier. Hugely grateful to all at St Luke's for all that they have done for the children, and the care and commitment which they demonstrate. Thank you!

Overall, I have been impressed by the thoughtfulness of the set tasks and the interesting, blended quality of the lesson planning - this is an enormous improvement on the first lockdown. The problem is that a lot of the set exercises still rely on a parent to closely supervise the work. This is almost impossible to achieve if you have an active toddler to look after as well. So, the more the chosen tasks can be set up to be carried out by the child without a lot of assistance, the better!

This time it is a lot better thank you. It really helps to have a list of tasks to get through and I really appreciate all that the teachers are doing and their positive feedback on the work handed in. We are incredibly grateful to all at the school and hugely understanding of the challenges that they face.

All in all, it is much better than the 1st lockdown, but we really worry about the gaps in knowledge.

The call with the class twice a day are great: it brings routine and the children are really happy to see their teacher and classmates. It is nice that they do games, reading, show and tell. Could maybe the spelling test also be done on Fri morning by the teacher? It will give a bit of motivation to learn the words. Same with the times tables, a test with the teacher.

# Do you have any comments about the remote education provision provided by school, positive or negative?

Sometimes it is overwhelming the amount of work to do in one day, we try to do maths and English at least everyday. It was good the teacher said the children should not spend more than an hour on each subject, but it is sometimes really hard to get it done in that time.

I can't express enough how thankful I am that my children attend St. Luke's. The staff have gone above & beyond to provide excellent home learning material on top of teaching in school. I can't imagine how many extra hours she puts in providing excellent videos & regular feedback to pupils. It is a real comfort to know that my children are still very happy & eager to learn in these strange times. Thank you so much to every single member of staff.

I think it is excellent. It is definitely encouraging my older child to become more independent with his learning. The teachers are brilliant with their feedback which really motivates the children. The only thing I am not that keen on is the National Academy lessons. They can be a bit long and not all that inspiring.

I am really pleased by how much more is being provided this time. And because of the way it is provided and structured my child can carry out most of her learning with minimal parental input. The zoom lessons are a great addition as it builds in the much needed social interaction. Feedback from the teacher is regular and very helpful.

Many other schools are running live lessons for several hours a day - I can't understand why that wouldn't work at St Luke's. If it won't work for some reason, we would prefer a text book.
