The survey was completed by 215 pupils from Reception to Year 6 classes. 0.47% represents 1 pupil.

#### **SURVEY SUMMARY COMMENTS**

Three questions received the highest proportion of positive responses from pupils. Enjoyment of school, teachers helping pupils to do their best and the school encouraging pupils to look after their physical health all received 100% and show an increase in scores from the previous year.

The question which received the lowest proportion of positive responses from pupils was centred on the behaviour of pupils in lessons where 93.0% of pupils felt it was good. 5.6% (12 pupils) felt it was almost never good and 1.4% (3 pupils) felt it was never good. Interestingly, a higher proportion of pupils felt that the behaviour around the school is good with 98.6% giving a positive response.

11 out of 17 questions show an increase in the proportion of positive responses compared to the pupil survey conducted last year. The largest increase was seen in the question relating to safeguarding and having an adult to talk to if pupils have something that is worrying them. Two other questions showed a strong increase with the question relating to pupils taking part in school activities / clubs and the question where teachers listen to pupils when they have something to say in lessons. It was also pleasing to see that pupils enjoy their learning at St Luke's, which showed an increase with 99.5% positive responses verses 98.6% last year.

There were a few questions that showed a decrease in positive responses including the question about teachers giving pupils challenging work where 8 pupils disagreed. Whilst 4 pupils would not recommend St Luke's to a friend moving to the area, 211 pupils would and this includes an increase in the proportion of pupils (+1.2%) who said they would say yes to the same question.

In summary, the survey shows very positive opinions from pupils at the school whilst highlighting several actions to improve our educational offer including:

- Using pupil voice to understand why some pupils do not enjoy school.
- Focus on challenge across the school in monitoring and learning walk focus.
- Behaviour analysis to identify pupils not following rules and systems in lessons and address this.
