



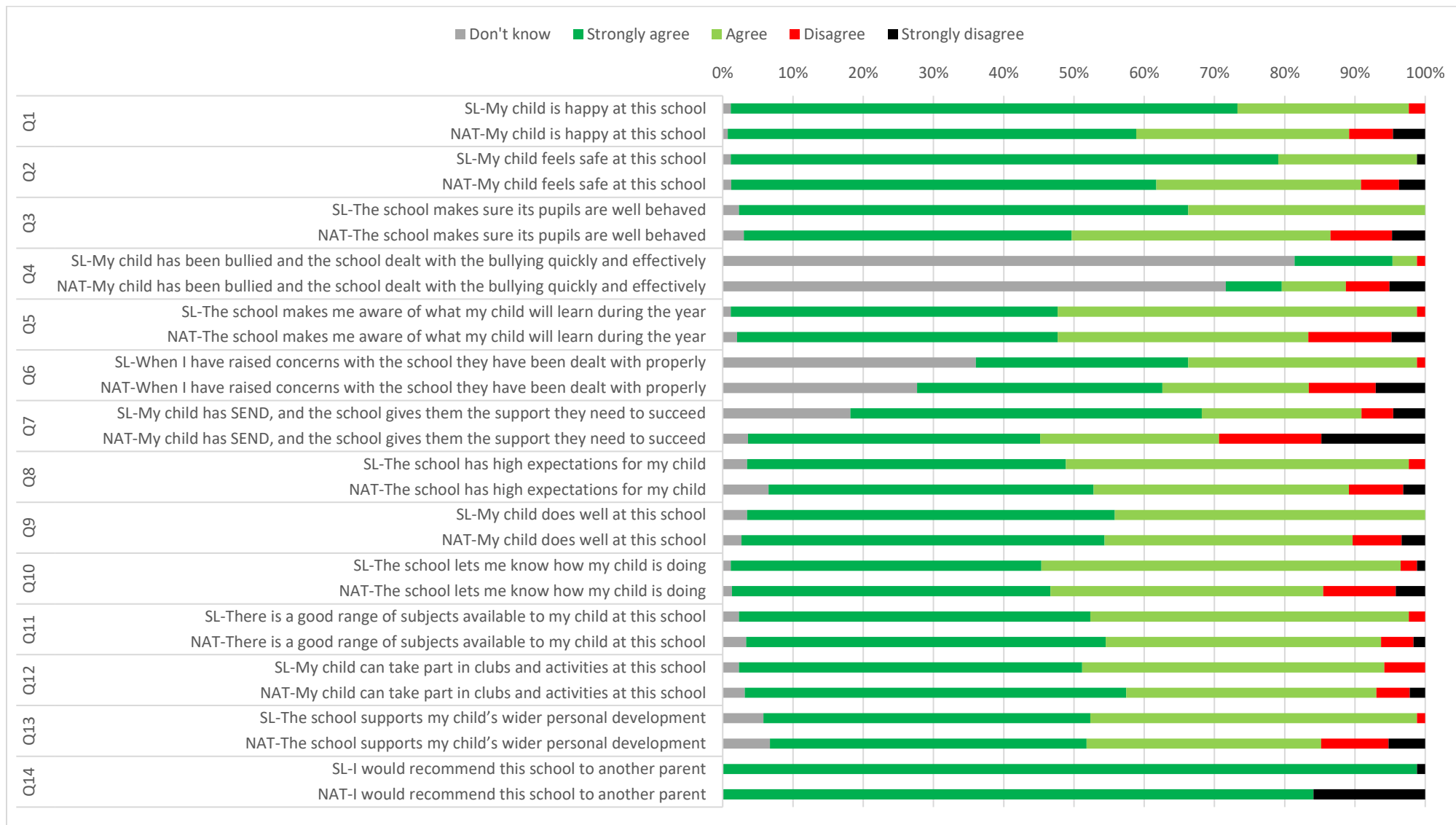

SUMMARY HEADLINES

- The survey was completed online using a Google Form.
- There were 86 responses.
- 85 responses said that they would recommend St Luke's to another parent.
- There were strong positive responses for a number of questions including:
 - The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved (100%);
 - My child does well at this school (100%);
 - My child feels safe at this school (98.8%);
 - My child has been bullied and St Luke's dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively (98.8%);
 - St Luke's makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year (98.8%);
 - When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly (98.8%);
 - St Luke's supports my child's wider personal development (98.8%).

The large majority of responses from parents were positive, although there were two questions which received fewer than 95% positive responses. The first question was around support that children with SEND receive in order to succeed. This question also showed a decrease in the proportion of positive responses received when compared to the previous year. Despite this slightly lower score, it is still over 20% higher than the result nationally. The second question with less than 95% positive results related to children being able to access clubs and activities at the school. Although lower than 95%, it was still higher than national scores and a higher score to last year's survey results.

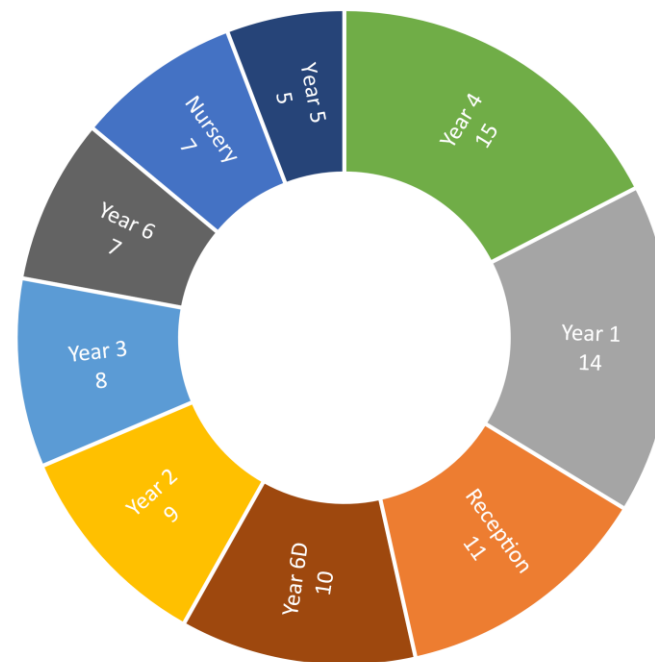
The majority of results showed an increase when compared to last year with two questions receiving greater than 4% increase in positive responses. The first was the question relating to the school having high expectations for children (+4.3%) whilst the second was relating to the school supporting children's wider personal development (+4.5%). Other pleasing increases were seen with the school making parents aware of what the children will be learning during the year (+3.7%) and dealing quickly to resolve any bullying incidents (+2.1%).

There were four questions which had a reduction in positive responses compared to the survey conducted last year. The largest differences were seen in the question already mentioned related to children with SEND and the question related to children feeling safe at the school (-1.2% - one parent).

In summary, the survey shows very positive opinions from parents whilst highlighting several actions to continue to support families:

- Analyse club memberships and review provision of clubs across the school.
- Focus on SEND pupils and their progress – in monitoring and learning walk focus.

Additional Comments

What could we improve?

More opportunities of parent/ teachers communication (e.g. more than 2 times of parents day).

Stretching work for more able children.

More spaces for after school clubs.

More space for activities.

Provide additional deepening opportunities and new topics like AI.

To offer extra sessions in subjects e.g. maths and English where kids are identified as needing more help. This will save parents time, effort and money trying to find a tutor when needs are identified at parent-teacher interview.

More learning based around Taskmaster style problem solving.

Increase number of tests in school and homework to support preparation for secondary school.

Meal options please.

In summer time, I suggest incorporating more shaded areas in the play zones where there are no trees (ideally, try to have trees). Providing ample shade or an alternative to shield kids from direct sunlight would contribute significantly to their comfort and well-being during outdoor activities.

Parents evenings are far to short and rushed.

It would be great if school can provide better meal options.

You are already in right direction.

Would like to see more languages for younger children.

More spaces available for lunch club would also be good.

More menu options for school dinners would be good as we provide packed lunches on the days my child does not like the food.

Possibly provide some structured guidance to support children at home with areas they find challenging?

Ensure all sessions for parents that happen during work hours are available via an online platform to maximise chance for working parents to join or watch later.

More club options for reception, more spaces for after school club.

We feel the Christmas holiday is too long - does the school really need to be off for almost 20 days?

Development of a debating society in KS2 to encourage the children to hear different points of view and consider different social perspectives.

Again nothing major.

More ways to help the increasing number of families whose first language is not English to integrate in the school community.

There were originally a lack of clubs for year 4 children but this was addressed after the reps communicated at the Parents Council - which demonstrated the school's commitment to listening to parents and responding positively.
