

Returning to St Luke's C.E. Primary School

What will my classroom be like?



You will have up to 13 children in your class and you will have a desk each. You will have all your resources provided for you so you don't need to share. You will have the same class teacher teaching you most of the time.

What will my lessons be like?



You will do similar lessons to normal lessons in school with perhaps maths and English in the morning and everything else in the afternoon. At the beginning, we will spend some time learning the new rules about being in school and will give you the chance to share your lockdown experience.

Will we have assemblies / collective worship?



Yes but not as you might remember them. Teachers will lead collective worship in your classrooms which will include our normal SuperStar assembly on Mondays and hymn practice on Tuesdays. You will also find out what happened to Gaston and his weighing scales!

What time will school start/ end?



All children will come in either through the entrance on Acre or Elm Road from 3rd June. All year groups will come into school at different times to reduce contact between the bubbles. Likewise, school will end at different times too. School finishes earlier on Fridays so the school can be given a deeper clean so it is ready for the next week.

How will I keep safe in school?



We have organised smaller class groups for every class called bubbles. Each bubble will be its own 'family' and you won't have contact with any other bubble. You will be reminded regularly to wash your hands throughout the day. You will be with the same one or two adults all day every day.

Where will I eat my lunch?



You will eat your lunch in your classroom with your friends and an adult. You can still order a packed lunch from the kitchen (including a cheese, tuna, ham or egg sandwich) or you can bring in a packed lunch from home.

Can I play outside?



Yes, each bubble will get to play in a different area of our school grounds supervised by an adult. It is important you have time to enjoy the fresh air and we are lucky with our outside area. You will be the first year groups to enjoy our newly developed outdoor areas - how exciting!

Will I wear school uniform?



Yes, you should come to school wearing school uniform, including school shoes. It has been a while since you have been at school so you may have outgrown some of your uniform. If this is the case, you parents will give you alternative clothes / shoes to wear temporarily whilst they purchase new uniform. I suggest a (named) sun hat might be a good idea when sunny!
