






Foreign Language (Latin) Subject Concepts:

Connecting to the 'bigger picture' through our key concepts

	<h3>Translation</h3>	<p>By the time children finish Year 6, they will be able to translate simple Latin sentences into English, recognising familiar words and phrases. They will understand the meaning of basic texts and be able to translate back into Latin using appropriate vocabulary and grammar. They will develop the ability to use context clues to assist in translation and build a basic Latin-English lexicon.</p>
	<h3>Language Influence</h3>	<p>By the time children finish Year 6, they will be able to explore the influence of Latin on modern languages, particularly English, and understand how Latin roots, prefixes, and suffixes have shaped vocabulary in many languages. They will recognise Latin-derived words and phrases in everyday language and learn how Latin has contributed to scientific, medical, and legal terminology.</p>
	<h3>Culture & History</h3>	<p>By the time children finish Year 6, they will be able to learn about the cultural and historical context in which Latin was spoken, exploring aspects of Ancient Roman life, government, mythology, and daily routines. They will examine how the Latin language connects to the Roman Empire's legacy and how it has influenced Western civilisation.</p>
	<h3>Vocabulary & Grammar</h3>	<p>By the time children finish Year 6, they will be able to acquire a wide range of Latin vocabulary, including words related to family, numbers, colours, time, and simple actions. They will develop an understanding of Latin grammar. Children will practice applying this vocabulary and grammar to form basic sentences and ask simple questions.</p>
	<h3>Sentence Structure</h3>	<p>By the time children finish Year 6, they will be able to learn how Latin sentence structure differs from English, understanding the role of word endings to show the function of nouns, adjectives, and verbs in a sentence. They will gain a basic understanding of how word order can change based on grammatical purpose, such as asking questions, making statements, or expressing commands. Children will practice building simple sentences and questions, exploring how Latin uses tenses and cases to express meaning.</p>
